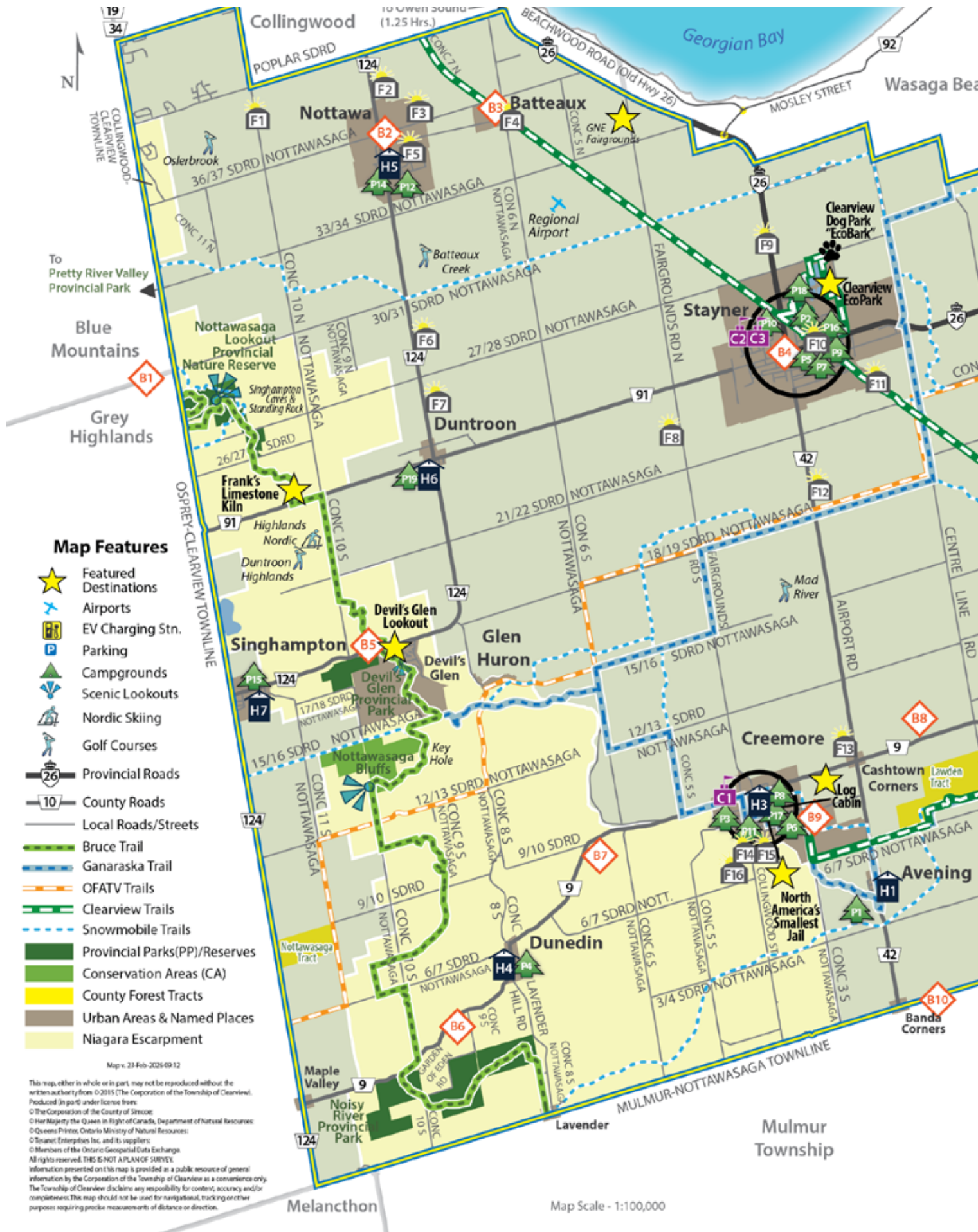

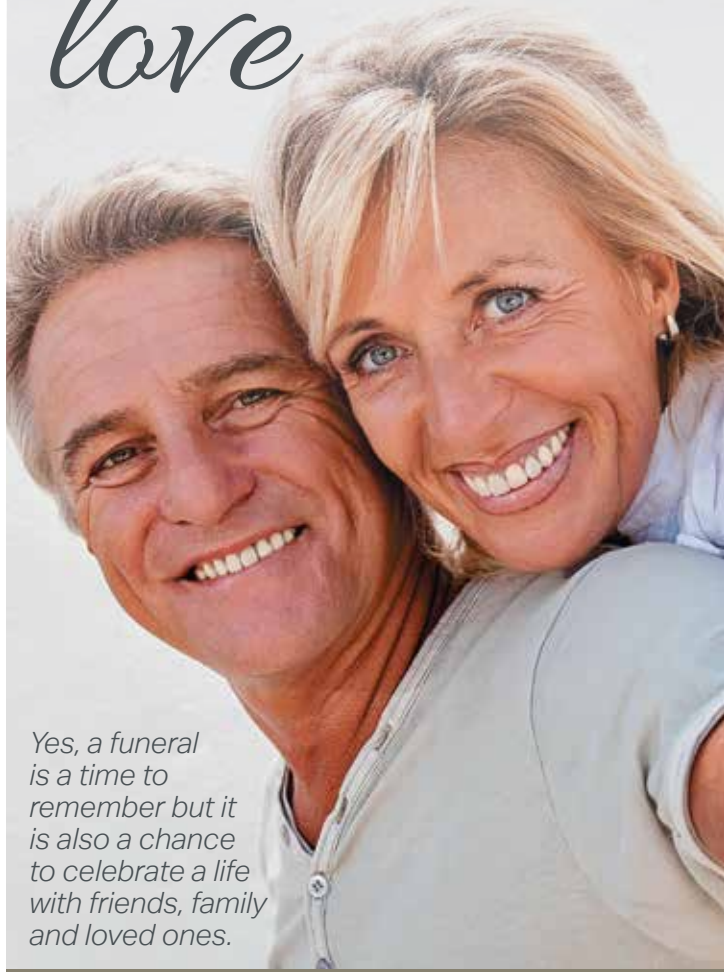

HERITAGE SITES

CREEMORE LOG CABIN – EARLY 1870S, RELOCATED 2011

Built at the edge of the village at George and Mary Streets using locally harvested trees, this cabin is the last original log house in Creemore. Home to James and Abigail Scarrow and their ten children, and later to the Veitch and Shaw families, it remained occupied for generations, with Marlyn Shaw as its final resident. Though altered over time, its original structure endured, and in the early 2000s community volunteers raised funds to save and relocate it to a central village site on former railway land. Now owned by Clearview Township and supported by volunteers, the cabin serves as a space for cultural exhibits and programs, with “History Hosts” welcoming visitors on Saturday mornings from Victoria Day to Thanksgiving.

EDENVALE CLASSIC AIRCRAFT FOUNDATION & MUSEUM

The Edenvale Classic Aircraft Foundation (ECAF) is a non-profit heritage aviation museum located in Hangars C and D at Edenvale Aerodrome in Stayner, Ontario, dedicated to preserving and sharing the legacy of WWII-era Canadian aviation. Supported by volunteer members, ECAF restores, maintains, and flies vintage aircraft from circa 1943, including the de Havilland Tiger Moth and Fairchild PT-26 Cornell, offering scenic flights over Clearview Township. The museum is open Thursdays or by appointment and serves as a gathering place for aviation enthusiasts, local stories, and shared history, with its 36th Annual Gathering of the Classics scheduled for Saturday, August 8, 2026 (rain date August 9).

NORTH AMERICA'S SMALLEST JAIL – 1892

Under the direction of the village constable, this small lock-up served for nearly fifty years as a secure holding place for local lawbreakers, jailing those charged with minor offences overnight and detaining others until transfer to the County Sheriff in Barrie. Beyond law enforcement, it also offered social relief, particularly during the Depression, when transient individuals found temporary shelter and meals at village expense. Closed in the 1940s due to new provincial regulations, it reopened in the 1960s as a tourist attraction proudly known as “North America’s Smallest Jail,” a title Creemore continues to embrace. Open to the public from May through October, the lock-up reflects the village’s enduring spirit and big heart.

THE WEST CHURCH MEMORIAL

The West Church Memorial stands on a prominent knoll in the Pretty River Valley, a place stewarded for millennia by First Nations peoples and later settled in the 1830s by Scottish Presbyterians, many from the Isle of Islay. Since 1853, three successive West Nottawasaga Presbyterian churches rose on this site, each serving as a spiritual and community centre before being lost to fire or time, with the final church removed in 2022 due to safety concerns. In 2024, this memorial was created to honour those who worshipped, served, and are buried here. Ten elm trees trace the footprint and windows of the former church, a boulder symbolizes the enduring presence of the Holy Spirit, and stone pews invite reflection, remembrance, and continued fellowship in this sacred place.
