#### **CLEARVIEW-COLLINGWOOD TRAIN TRAIL**

Difficulty: Easy

Length: 14 km (each way)

Station Museum, Collingwood to Station Park, Stayner Spanning from Collingwood to Stayner, the Clearview Train Trail is a crushed gravel, linear trail connecting to the Collingwood Train Trail. It follows an abandoned rail line which used to be part of the Ontario Simcoe and Huron Railway system connecting Collingwood to Toronto and was built between 1851 and 1855. Prior to its abandonment in 1960, passengers enjoyed views of the tranquil landscape along the way. Now used as a multi-use trail, hikers and bikers can enjoy this flat railbed, stopping in either Stayner or Collingwood for lunch or a break. www.discoverclearview.ca

#### **CREEMORE LOOP**

Difficulty: Moderate/Advanced

Length: 60 km (loop)

Start: Fisher Fields Park, Collingwood

Heading counter clockwise out of the Town of Collingwood, the first portion which passes the Collingwood International Airport is relatively flat and perfect for your warm up. After crossing County Road 91 you enter more challenging rolling terrain. But the challenge is worth it, as you have multiple opportunities to view the beautiful Mad River along the way. If you are looking for an opportunity to stop and soak up the culture, be sure to take a break in Creemore, approximately half way through your ride. This town, known for it's mouth watering restaurants and coffee shops, has art galleries, shopping and more! On your way back in to Collingwood, be sure your legs are ready for the Fairgrounds Road climb, which is a difficult but short climb to a fantastic view of Georgian Bay.

Look for the Franks Kiln Side Trail to see the kiln once used by early settlers to burn dolostone rock to create lime, and the Freedom Rock, with inscriptions on it made by people of days gone by.







## **HERITAGE SITES**

#### Creemore Log Cabin - early 1870s, relocated 2011

First built at the edge of the village (at George and Mary streets) and constructed with trees harvested locally, this is the last original log house in Creemore. Its first residents were James & Abigail Scarrow and their ten children. Early in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, Joseph & Emily Veitch made it their family home, followed by their daughter, Hazel (Veitch) Shaw. Its last resident, Marlyn Shaw, lived in it alone for many years.

Over time, the cabin's exterior was radically altered, and its interior changed, but the basic structure remained. Early in this century, community volunteers raised funds to save the building and to reconstruct it centrally in the village on vacant former railway land. Owned by Clearview Township, the cabin is financially supported and administered by volunteers. It serves as a venue for cultural exhibits and programs. "History Hosts" welcome visitors on Saturday mornings from Victoria Day to Thanksgiving,

#### North America's Smallest Iail – 1892

Under the direction of the village Constable, this little "lock-up" served for half a century as a secure place to jail lawbreakers. For offences like drunkenness or disturbing the peace, inmates were lodged here over night. Those charged with more serious crimes were held here until transported to the County Sheriff in Barrie.

The lock-up not only jailed lawbreakers, it occasionally provided social service. From its earliest years – and especially in the 1930s Depression – "tramps" found short-term shelter here and were fed at village expense.

In the 1940s, new provincial police regulations closed this local lock-up. In the 1960s it re-opened as a tourist attraction, promoted as "North America's Smallest Jail." Although other communities may contest the claim, Creemore continues to affirm its title as a village with "a big heart and the smallest jail." From May through October, the little lock-up is open daily to the public.
